1	Magnify	To increase the size of something.	 <p>Van Gogh – Sunflowers, 1888 Vincent Van Gogh was a Dutch artist born in 1858. He spent most of his time painting and drawing in France. He was not famous in his lifetime. After his death his brother Theo promoted his work. Van Gogh's paintings are amongst the world's most expensive paintings.</p>  <p>Georgia O'Keeffe – Red Canna, 1924 Born in 1887, Georgia O'Keeffe was an American artist who painted nature in a way that showed how it made her feel.</p>
2	Complementary colours	pairs of colours that contrast with each other more than any other colour, and when placed side-by-side make each other look brighter.	
3	Papier-mâché	a mixture of pieces of paper and glue. It can be made, while still damp, into objects such as bowls, ornaments, and models.	
4	Relief Prints	a process consisting of cutting a printing surface in such a way that all that remains of the original surface is the design to be printed.	
5	Pattern	An arrangement of shapes, lines, letters, numbers or colours that can be repeated or used again and again.	
6	Interior Design	The colours, curtains, lighting, pictures, wall paper and fabrics used to decorate a room or building.	
7	Texture	How something feels when it is touched.	
8	Sculpture	The creation of artistic objects in three dimensions – length, width and height.	
9	Blend	To gradually and gently join two colour, tones or images together.	
10	Tessellation	An arrangement of shapes close together in a repeated pattern, without gaps or overlapping.
