1	Magnify	To increase the size of something.	 <p>Van Gogh – Sunflowers, 1888 Vincent Van Gogh was a Dutch artist born in 1858. He spent most of his time painting and drawing in France. He was not famous in his lifetime. After his death his brother Theo promoted his work. Van Gogh’s paintings are amongst the world’s most expensive paintings.</p> 
2	Complementary colours	pairs of colours that contrast with each other more than any other colour, and when placed side-by-side make each other look brighter.	
3	Blend	To gradually and gently join two colour, tones or images together.	
4	Texture	How something feels when it is touched.	
5	Sculpture	The creation of artistic objects in three dimensions – length, width and height.	
6	Papier-mâché	a mixture of pieces of paper and glue. It can be made, while still damp, into objects such as bowls, ornaments, and models.	
7	Form	a three-dimensional object in space	
8	Collaborative Art	artwork that involves working as a team to create art,	
9	Botany	the study of plants	
10	Botanist	a scientist who studies plants, including flowering plants, and plant-like things such as moss and seaweed.
