Joseph Mallord William Turner was born in Covent Garden, London on the 27 January 1775. His father was a barber and wig maker. Turner was self-taught; he never trained as an artist but learned quickly and was very talented. When he was a boy his mother was very ill so Turner was sent to stay with his uncle on the banks of the River Thames. It was here that he first started to paint. By the time he went to school he had created many drawings, which his father exhibited in his shop window. He entered the Royal Academy of Art in 1789, when he was only I+ years old.
