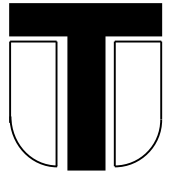


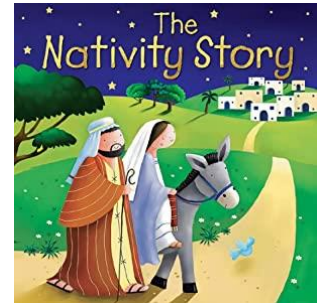

Why do Christians believe God gave Jesus to the world?



Knowledge

- Christians believe that Jesus was God, born on Earth in the flesh.
- Jesus is known as the son of God.
- Christians believe that God gave Jesus as a gift to the world: he acted as a role model, guiding people on how to live good lives.
- Christians believe that God sent Jesus as a saviour as part of His rescue plan, so that people could be close to God again.
- Christians believe that God didn't plan for Jesus to save the world by himself but by teaching people to love each other and the world.
- Christians believe that some parts of the Nativity were extraordinary and show that Jesus was God, born in the flesh.
- Christians believe that parts of the Nativity show Jesus' birth as lowly, showing he had come to rescue everyone.



Vocabulary

Christian = someone who practises the religion of Christianity

Christmas = the Christian celebration of Jesus' birth, held on 25th December each year

God = the Christian creator, Lord and King of all creation

Jesus = God in the flesh (in human form), known as the son of God

lowly = of low importance or wealth

Nativity = the story of Jesus' birth

role model = someone who sets a good example to others by doing what is right, even if it isn't easy

saviour = a person who saves others. In Christianity, used as a name for Jesus who took on people's wrongdoing so that they can be close to God.
