What can Jesus' stories teach us?

Knowledge

- Christians believe that Jesus told stories to teach people; these stories are called parables.
- The story of the good Samaritan teaches people to 'love thy neighbour' (treat everyone with love and kindness).
- The story of the lost sheep teaches that God cares for everyone equally and that everyone is important to God.
- The story of the wise and foolish builders teaches that things turn out well when we listen to good advice and follow it, even when it's not easy.
- Christians believe that Jesus encouraged people to listen to him and follow his advice.



Vocabulary

advice = information that will help someone else

equal = worth the same, have the same value

foolish = someone who is silly and makes the wrong choices

foundations = the bottom part of a building which makes it strong

love thy neighbour = treat everyone with love and kindness

parable = a story with a lesson, often told by Jesus

wise = someone who knows lots, including how to act sensibly
