Knowledge

- Journeys can be special for a number of reasons, including religious reasons.
- There are many sites around the world that are important to people for religious reasons; people journey from far and wide to these special places.
- A journey to a special or important religious place is called a pilgrimage.
- Pilgrims go on pilgrimage for many reasons, for example to show their faith or to deepen their connection with God.
- The most important pilgrimage for Hindus is to the Ganges, a river in India.
- Pilgrims bathe in the waters of the Ganges to cleanse themselves.
- One important pilgrimage for Christians is to Lourdes in France. It is believed that miracles have happened there.
- Pilgrims drink and wash their faces with the water in Lourdes, which is said to have healing powers.

apparition = an appearance, the belief that a religious person from the past miraculously appears
Christian = someone who practises the religion of Christianity
Christianity = the largest religion in the world, based on the belief in one God and the teachings of Jesus
cleanse = to make something clean, for example the heart or the soul
faith = belief in a religion
Ganges = a river in India which has religious importance to Hindus and is a pilgrimage site
healing = becoming healthy again
Hindu = someone who practised the religion of Hinduism
Hinduism = the third-largest religion in the world, based on the belief in one god (Brahman) with many forms
Lourdes = a city in France which has religious importance to Christians and is a pilgrimage site
miracle = a wonderful event that cannot be explained, thought to be the work of God
pilgrim = someone who goes on a pilgrimage
pilgrimage = a journey to a special or important religious place
