






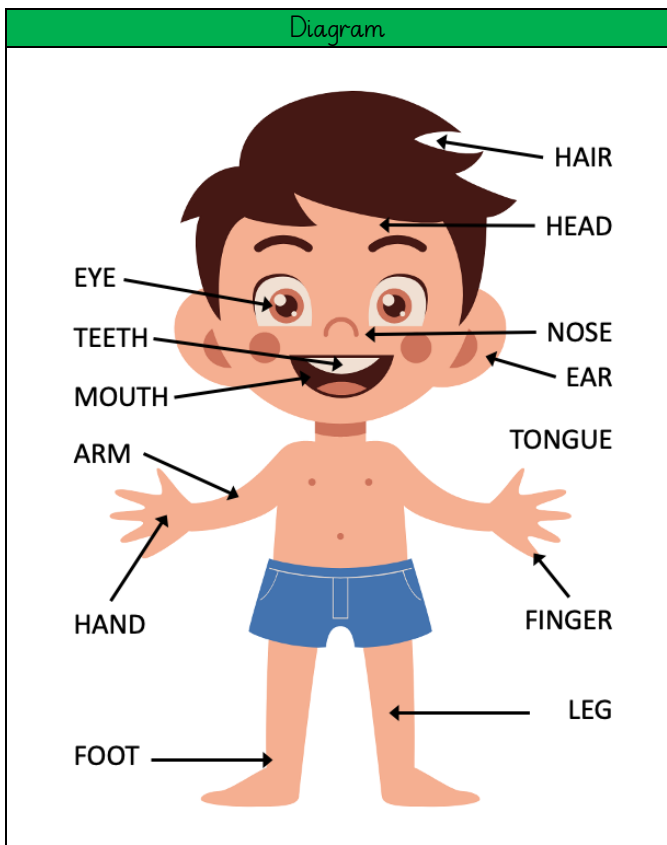


Key Knowledge	
What do the different parts of our bodies do?	Our eyes allow us to see. Our ears let us hear. Our noses enable us to smell. Our tongues allow us to taste things. We can bite food with our teeth. Our fingers let us feel and hold things. Our legs allow us to stand up and walk.
How are we similar? How are we different?	As children, we generally all have the same body parts. However, what they look like may vary. E.g., we have different colour eyes and hair.
How are we similar to animals? How are we different from them?	Some animals have some body parts that are the same as ours – horses have legs; others have body parts to allow them to do different things – birds have wings
Where do animals live?	Animals, including us, live in habitats. Where animals live provides them with air, food, water and shelter.

beak	A beak is the hard, pointed structure sticking out from a bird's face.
claw	A sharp, usually thin and curved nail on the finger or toe of an animal.
dry	Not soaked in water .
feathers	The soft covering on a bird's body that keeps it warm.
food	Food is what people and animals eat to survive. Food usually comes from animals or plants.
fur	The hairy coat of some animals especially when fine, soft, and thick.
paws	The paws of an animal such as a cat , dog , or bear are its feet , which have claws for gripping things and soft pads for walking on.
safe	Free from harm or danger.
scales	Small strong plates that cover an animal's skin to protect it.
warmth	A feeling of being warm, not cold.
water	the liquid that comes from the clouds as rain and is needed for us to live.
wing	A part of a bird's body that usually allows it to fly.
