bendy (flexible)	An object that bends easily into a curved shape	
fabric	Cloth or other material produced by weaving together cotton, wool or other threads.	
foil	Sheets of metal as thin as paper	
glass	A hard, transparent material	
hard	A material that is hard does not scratch or dent easily.	
material	Metal, plastic, wood, glass just some of the materials we use to make the things that surround us.	
leather	A tough, flexible material, made from the skin of an animal.	
metal	Substances such as iron, steel, gold, or lead.	
plastic	A material which is light in weight and does not break easily.	
properties	The qualities or features that belong to something and make it recognisable	
rock	The hard substance from which the Earth is made.	
rough	A surface that is uneven and not smooth.	
shiny	A surface that is bright and reflects a lot of light.	
smooth	A surface with no roughness, lumps, or holes.	
soft	Not hard. Easily scratched or dented.	
stiff (rigid)	A material that does not easily bend.	
wood	The material from the trunk and branches of trees.
