Key Vocabulary	Definition	Examples of fun fair rides
1 Target Audience	A target audience is a specific group of people that you want to reach with your marketing. They usually have similar characteristics that make them best suited for your product or service. These characteristics can include age, gender, location, education, income, social class, and consumption habits.	
2 Functionality	The functionality of something is its usefulness, or how well it does the job it's meant to do.	
3 Aesthetics	Aesthetics is the branch of philosophy that is concerned with the nature of beauty and taste	
4 Lever	a simple type of mechanism in which a movement made at one end of the mechanism (input) creates a movement at the other end (output). It involves a rigid bar which moves around a pivot.	
5 Fixed Pivot	a fixed point supporting something that turns or balances.	
6 Loose Pivot	A central point or pin that joins levers together.	
7 Prototype	<p>A prototype is an early version of a product that designers make. It is often not as detailed as the final product. A prototype can be a fully working model of the product, a version where only part of it works, or a non-working model to see if the size and shape are right. Designers make prototypes so they can try out ideas to see if they will work or not.</p>	
8 Mechanism	A device used in a product to create movement.
