Vocabulary

Compound word -A word that contains two or more root words e.g. news+paper, ice+cream.

Common exception word — A word which can't be sounded out.

Root word — A basic word with no prefix or suffix added to it.

Prefix - A prefix is added at the beginning of a word in order to turn it into another word e.g. disappear.

Suffix - A suffix is an 'ending', used at the end of one word to turn it into another word e.g. teacher.

Homophone - Two different words are homophones if they sound exactly the same when pronounced e.g. hear/here.

High Frequency Word — A word which is used a lot in the English language.

Ascender — a letter which rises clearly above the other letters.

Descender — a letter which drops below the line.

Capital letters (upper case) — A variation of a letter form used at the beginning of letters and for proper nouns.

Lower case — letters which are formed in non-capital form.
