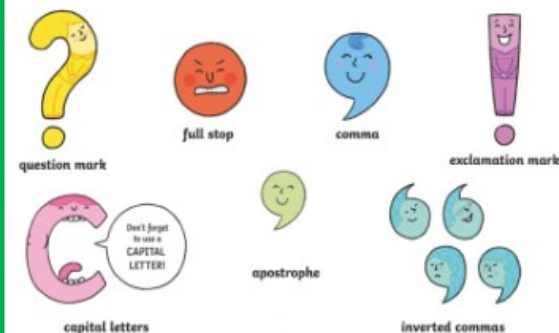

Vocabulary

Cursive — Joined handwriting

Adjective — Describes a noun e.g. blue table

Noun — Nouns are sometimes called 'naming words' because they name people, places and 'things' e.g. table, hotel

Verb — Verbs are sometimes called 'doing words' because many verbs name an action that someone does e.g. run, cook

Adverb — Describes the verb e.g. quickly, happily.

Question — Asks something e.g. Why aren't you my friend?

Statement — States a fact or something that has happened e.g. You are my friend.

Command — A direction for something you have to do; E.g. Be my friend!

Exclamation — When something is exclaimed- start with 'what' or 'how' E.g. What a good friend you are!

Noun phrase — A phrase with a noun and words used to describe it (usually an adjective, but can also be a determiner).

Expanded noun phrase — A phrase in which more than one word describe a noun (e.g. The bad dog).

Tense — Shows whether you are writing about the past, present or future.
